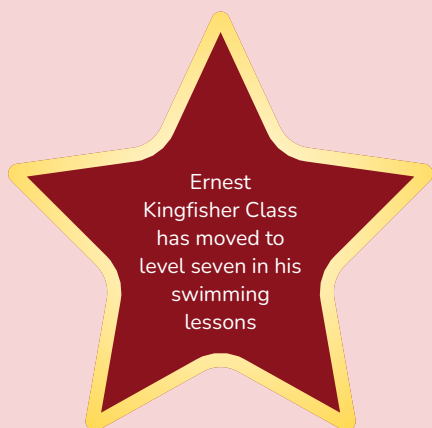

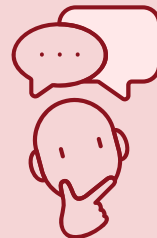
Talk and Thought Thursday.

Parent Governor Vacancy.

The school has a vacancy for parents to sit on the Governing Body, alongside other parents, school staff, members of the public and the Vicar of St John's Church.

The Governing Body acts as a "critical friend" to the school with guidance from the Senior Leadership Team of the school although the Head Teacher is responsible for making day-to-day decisions about the running of the school.

Governors are involved in deciding school policies, allocating the school's budget and appointing senior staff. No special qualifications, or experience are needed and the most important thing is to have a keen interest in the school and be prepared to play an active part in the governing body's work.
