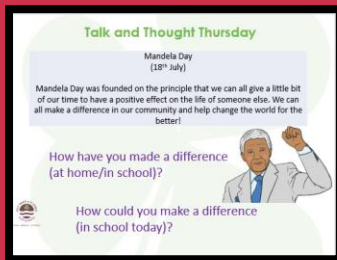

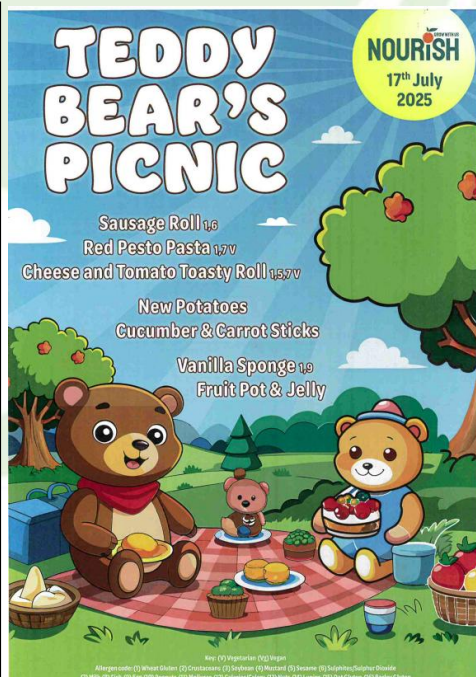
SPECIAL MENU DAYS
