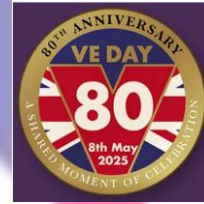

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UNIFORM REMINDER



It has come to our attention that children are not wearing the correct uniform to school.

We would like to remind you that children should not wear trainers, leggings or cycling shorts to school unless it is their PE day.

For health and safety reasons jewellery is not permitted in school.

Small stud earrings are allowed but where they are perceived as being a hazard, e.g., in P.E. and games, children should remove their own studs and look after them safely.

Where this is not possible, they should be taken out and left at home on P.E. and games days.

Please help your child to prepare for their day at school. All children should come to school wearing the correct school uniform and have everything they need with them for the school day. Don't forget water bottles and lunch boxes too!

On PE days your child must wear their school PE kit. No football shirts or different track suit bottoms/leggings or sweatshirts/hoodies.

We are able to offer a wide range of curricular and extra-curricular clubs and I would like to say a huge thank you to our staff who are providing this fantastic range of clubs for your children.

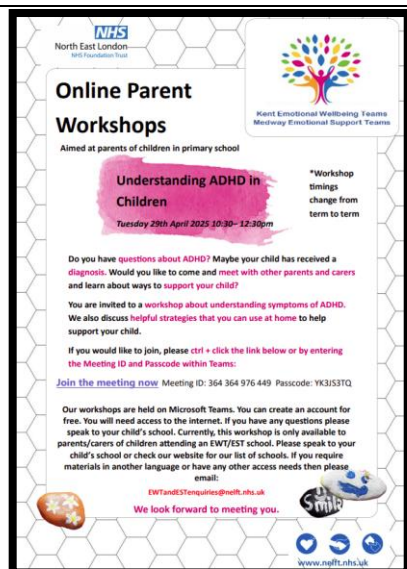

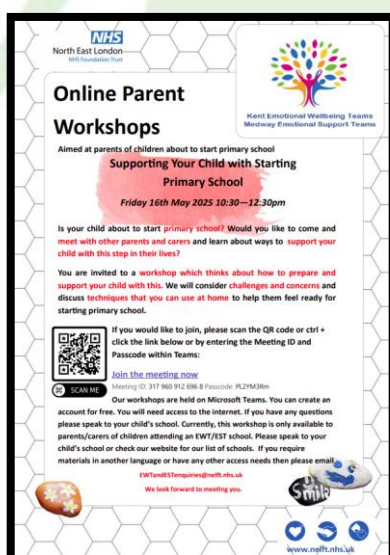

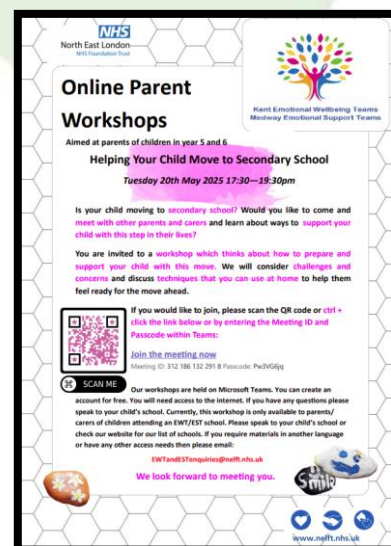
