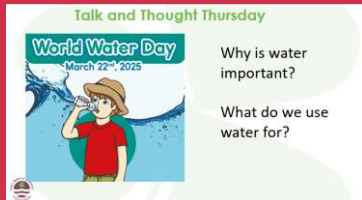
These two children each receive a £10 Amazon voucher.

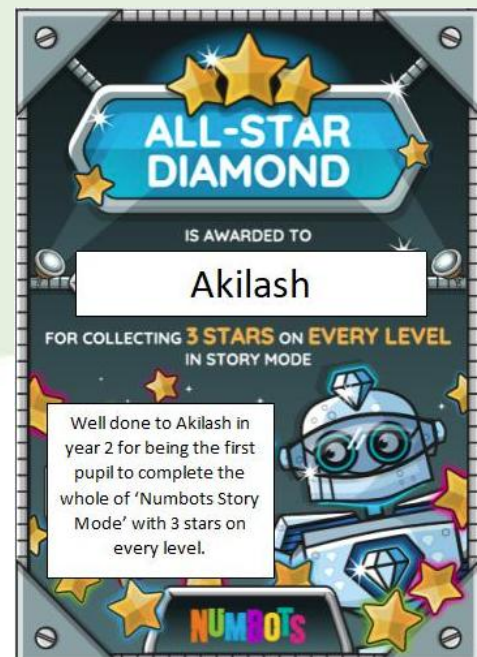

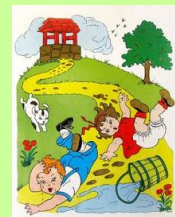
