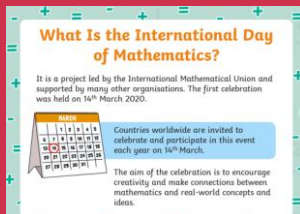

READ YOUR WAY - WORLD BOOK DAY 2025



Yesterday, pupils at HTSJ celebrated their love of books and reading, using the theme for this year's World Book Day of **'Read Your Way'**. The idea this year was for pupils to find WHERE, WHAT and WHEN they liked to read.

Research has shown, that many children struggle with finding texts they enjoy; are not confident readers or are battling against whether they can find time for reading rather than the enjoyment of screen time. The overall message of the day at HTSJ was to 'Read Your Way' by exploring texts, authors and places to read in addition to whether children preferred to share reading books together or do this individually.

The whole school used the text 'Quest' by Aaron Becker - the second book in the 'Journey' Trilogy - as an inspirational wordless picture book, to interpret, imagine, discuss and share ideas around the texts characters, plot and illustrations. Pupils used cross-curricular learning to create pieces of work inspired by the text, of which we had many outcomes; from musical soundtracks, drama, illustrations, new characters, own books being made, storyboards to name a few.

Many pupils and staff came dressed as their favourite characters for the day and every child also created their paper plate book character for the class competition.



Pupils throughout the day commented:

"I really enjoyed Quest, there were so many different ideas and discussion happening in my class and we all noticed different things from the pictures taking the story in different directions."

"I really liked dressing-up and reading in the library."

"I shared a book with my friend and it was fun to read together."

The Reading Ambassadors also recorded a story which was shared with all pupils at the end of the day.

A fun day was had by all and it was great to see so many children enjoying reading throughout the day.
