Use reading to inspire
the imagination. Art,

outdoor exploration.

Be Seen

Make sure you are seen
reading. It is good to set
aside some time for the
adult to read the things
they enjoy and the child
to read independently –
family reading time.
Keep books magazines
at easy reach.

Go Online

Listen to audio books on
long journeys or before
bed when you have a
busy day.

Get Out

Go to your public library
and local book shops
regularly.
Find the books you
loved as a child to read
together.
Explore new authors too
and find new favourites
too!

Make Space

Have a special place,
chair or a certain time
when you are able to
read together.

Read everything out loud.

Books, poems, nursery rhymes, newspaper & magazine articles, food labels...
anything that is close to hand!
