FAMILY THRIVE FOR PARENTS AND CARERS

We would like to invite you to join our Family Thrive course which will be starting at Holy Trinity and St John's School on Monday 13th January 2025.

This is an opportunity for parents and carers to take part in a five-week workshop that introduces the fundamentals of the Thrive approach and how it works in practice and for parents and carers to gain support with using Thrive at home.

We will be exploring –

- How the brain develops and how interruptions can affect the development
- How the right side of the brain talks to the left side of the brain
- Why play and creativity are so important to you and your child
- How to support your child at times of change and difficulty
- When and what triggers your and how to keep calm
- How to be a behaviour detective

These sessions will explore the amazing growth of a child's brain throughout childhood and introduce strategies to support their emotional development.

This course will be structured but in an informal way allowing for time to network with other parents and carers, ask questions and have an input into what would be most useful to you for future sessions.
