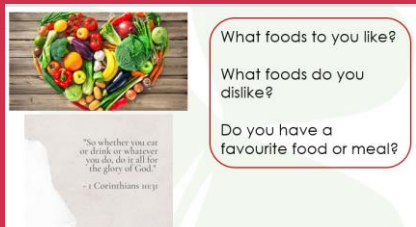

Holy Trinity and St John's C.E. Primary school believes in empowering young leaders and listening to our pupils' views around staying safe. To reflect this, we started a Safety Ambassadors program last year to select pupils from Year 6 to be our pupil voice.

As part of this program, our Safety Ambassadors meet weekly to learn about staying safe. We look at topics like how our school keeps pupils safe, what a healthy relationship is and road safety. They get to meet and interview a number of adults like social workers, police, domestic abuse support staff, to learn how other agencies keep them safe as well.

As a school with an amazingly diverse school community our Safety Ambassadors also help to ensure our school remains and inclusive space for all to reach their full potential.

Last year's safety ambassadors recognised that road safety is important for our school. They listened to parent concerns about parking at the start and end of school and decided they could help.

They organised a cake sale to raise funds to purchase new road signs for outside of our school to remind everyone to "Think before they park" to avoid endangering the lives of the children and families coming to and from our school.

Piper and Claude, our Head Pupils [in the photo] said;

"The way some of the cars park near our school is not safe. They block the crossing and we can't get through when walking or on our bikes and scooters."

With our new signs we are hoping everyone can "think before they park".
