READING IS REWARDING!

Did you know we have lots of rewards in school for reading?



Every read logged is exchanged to **house points**, these points can be used for buying things in the reward shop or reaching 500 points means a large reward such as ten pin bowling, cinema trip, inflatable fun etc.

We also have the book vending machine for pupils reading.

Pupils who take the **online quizzes** after every book they have read through their **Accelerated Reader account** earn tokens each term to exchange for their own book from the vending machine - there are several ways to earn the tokens.

The first three pupils who reach **a million words** of reading (this is noted by taking the online quizzes after each book) receive prizes such as a kindle, trip to the Marlowe Theatre, their choice of books up to £50 or a voucher etc.

Pupils can be nominated by their class adults each term to win a golden token to spend in the book vending machine.

Writing book reviews and handing them to Miss Wall or the Reading Ambassadors will also earn a golden token to spend in the vending machine.

Every week on the newsletter we also have the **percentage of each class for reading** three or more times a week, based on those handing in their reading logs, the class gets **a certificate and receive a non-uniform day the next Friday**.

If the same class win for three or more consecutive weeks the children get to **choose three books from the vending machine** that they can add to their class library to read.
