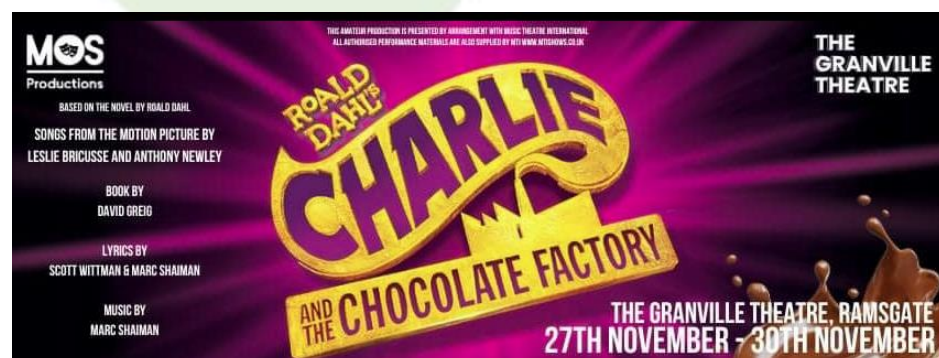
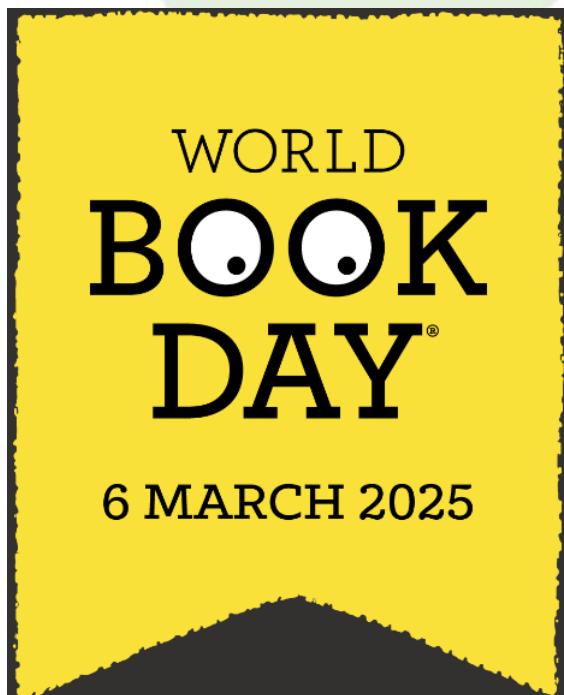
500 Words returns in just TWO weeks! The UK's biggest children's story writing competition will be open for entries on Tuesday 24 September from 8am.
